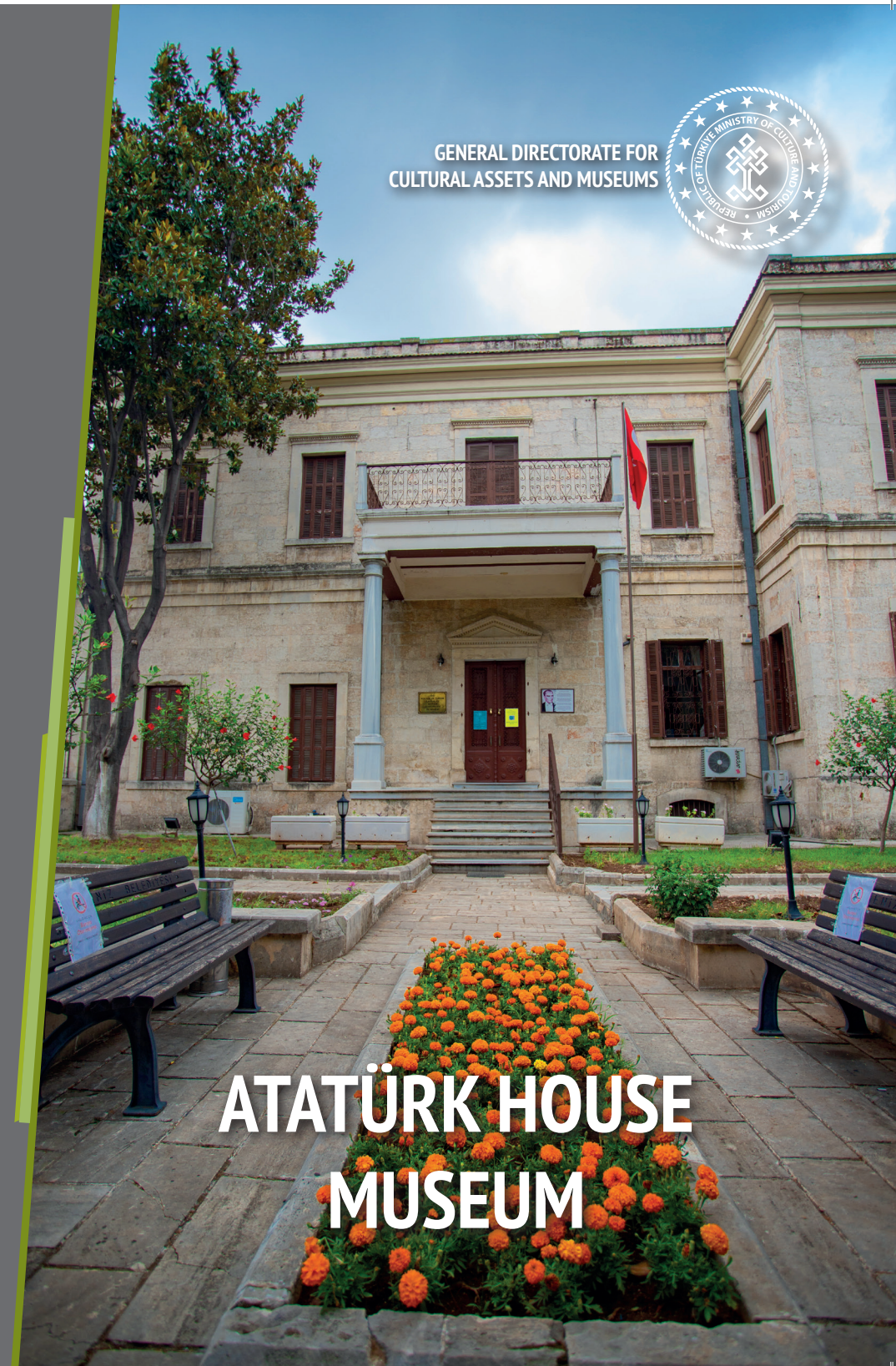

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ATATÜRK HOUSE MUSEUM



The building, located on Atatürk Caddesi in the city center of Mersin, was built as a residence in 1897 due to the marriage of the German Consul of the time, Mr. Christman, to the daughter of the merchant Mavromati of Mersin. The building, whose architect is unknown, is also known as "Christman Mansion".

Atatürk was hosted by the people of Mersin for 11 days in this house during his visit to Mersin with his wife, Latife Hanım, between 20 January and 2 February 1925 and it was later turned into a museum,

It was officially opened as "Atatürk House and Museum" in October 1992.

On the left panel at the entrance of the museum, there is the National Forces (Kuva-i Milliye) corner where the photographs of our soldiers who took part in the National Struggle are displayed.



Photographs taken during Atatürk's visit to Mersin and 22 personal belongings brought from the Anıtkabir Museum are exhibited on the ground floor of the museum, which is arranged as "Atatürk in Photographs and Documents". These include bathrobes, shirts, leggings, forks, knives, and spoons. On the upper floor where ethnographic artefacts are exhibited, there is a large hall at the center and seven rooms opening to this hall. With the donation of furniture belonging to his parents to our museum by Necdet ÖZCAN in 2017, the display of some rooms was partially renewed.
