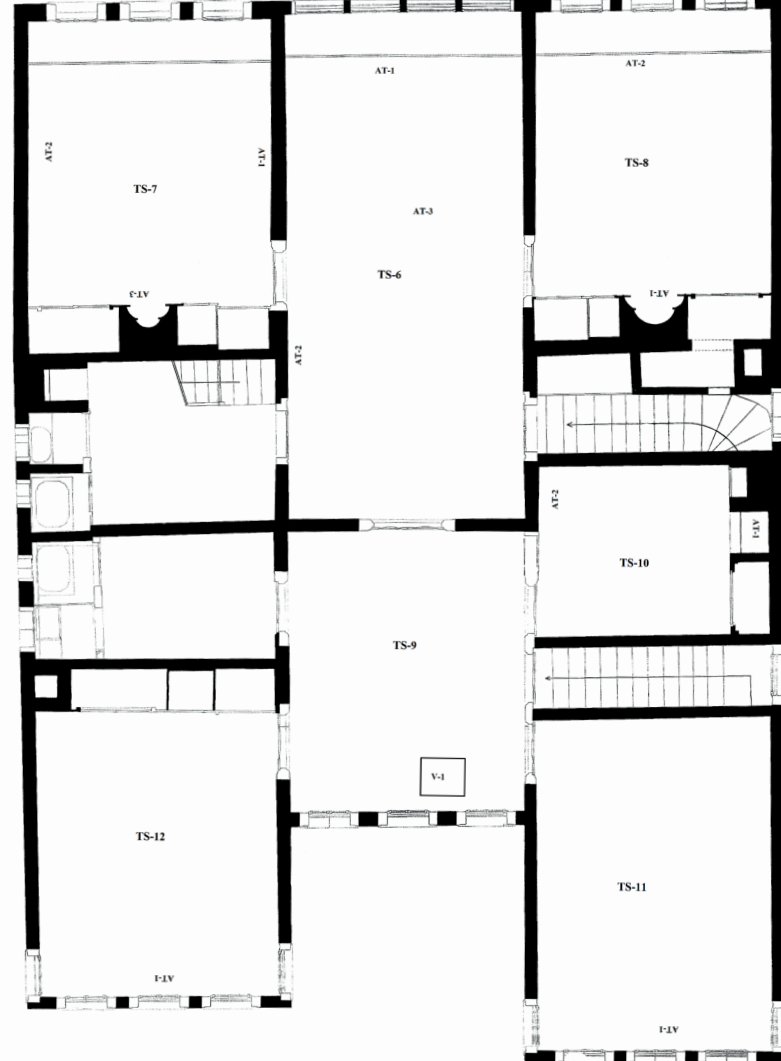


Tokat Atatürk House and Ethnography Museum

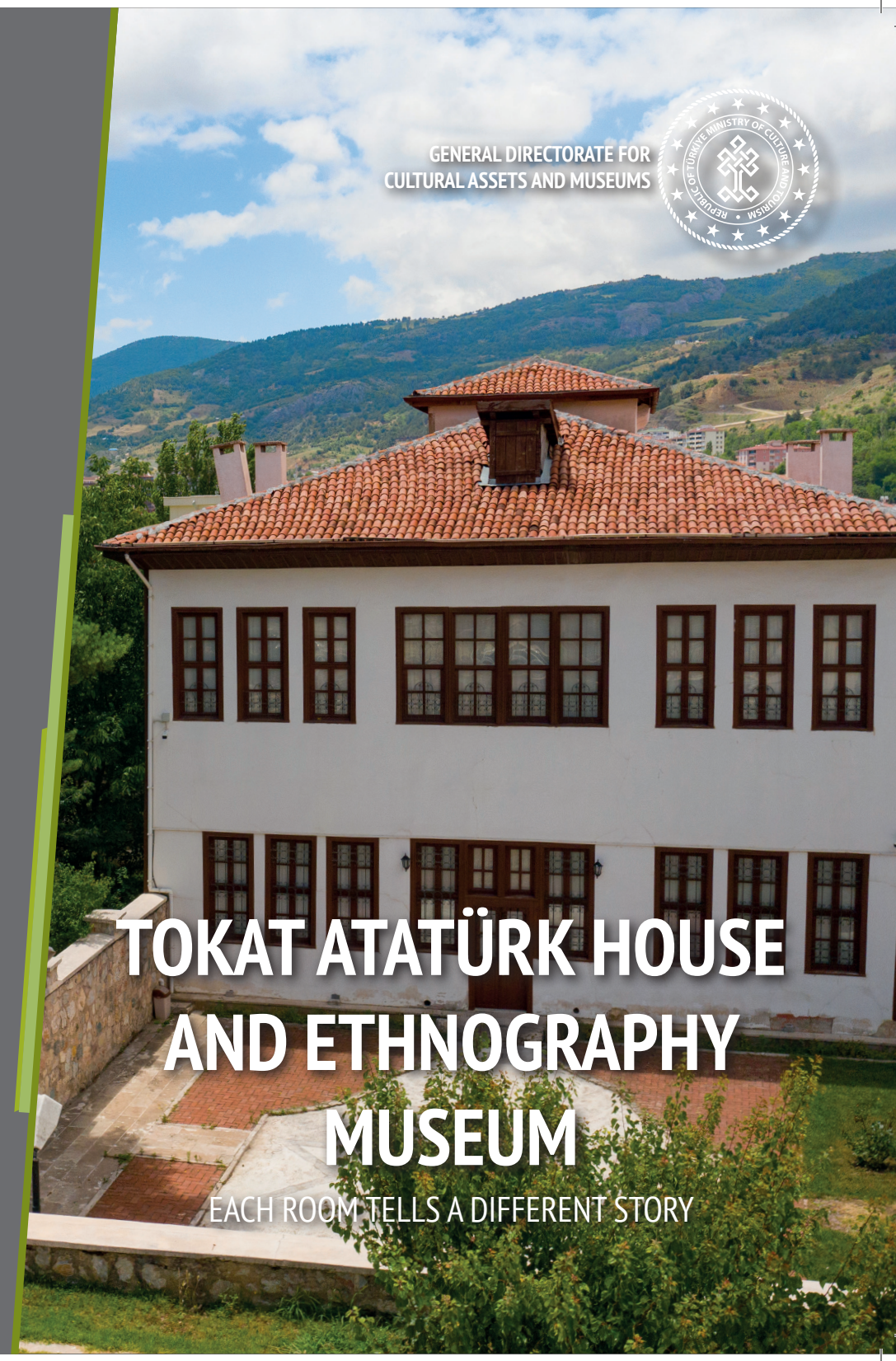

TOKAT ATATÜRK HOUSE AND ETHNOGRAPHY MUSEUM

EACH ROOM TELLS A DIFFERENT STORY



Tokat Atatürk House and Ethnography Museum is located in the Devegörmez neighborhood in the city center. Mustafa Kemal Atatürk visited Tokat six times in the years of National Struggle and during Republican Era and in three of these visits he stayed in this house owned by Mustafa Vasfi Süsoy. Mustafa Vasfi Süsoy (1876-1934); a soldier who served as Staff Officer during Atatürk's Çanakkale and Independence War, was his comrade-in-arms in the Bandırma Ferry and served as Tokat Deputy for four terms with the Republic, was always close to Atatürk and supported his work and ideas. During the visits to Tokat, he always hosted Atatürk in his own house. Atatürk's first visit to Tokat was on June 26, 1919, during the years of National Struggle. He stayed one night in this house owned by his firearm friend Mustafa Vasfi Süsoy.



Their second visit was with Latife Hanım on Thursday, September 25, 1924. Atatürk and Latife Hanım stayed in this house for two nights. In another visit of Atatürk to Tokat, on Wednesday, September 19, 1928, he moved to Sivas after giving a new alphabet lesson to the officers and the public at the Government Hall of the Tokat Government House and eating lunch at this house owned by Mustafa Vasfi SÜSOY.
